Please be advised that any modifications to the surface water management facilities must be approved by the Department of Planning and Environmental Protection prior to the commencement of construction.

In the event of a change in ownership of the licensed project, the new owner or operator must apply for a transfer of the license within thirty (30) days after sale or legal transfer. The original licensee shall remain liable for the performance of the system until the new owner is granted the transfer of the license.

Items to be submitted:

- 1) A log of the operation and maintenance schedules for all components of the surface water management facilities. Records of payments to contractors who have cleaned, dredged, replaced, repaired, etc. portions of the surface water management system would satisfy this requirement.
- 2) A certification letter signed and sealed by a Florida Registered Professional Engineer certifying that all components of the surface water management system are functioning as originally licensed. The suggested wording for this is as follows:

I HEREBY CERTIFY THAT ALL COMPONENTS OF THE SURFACE WATER MANAGEMENT SYSTEM FOR THE ABOVE REFERENCED PROJECT ARE FUNCTIONING IN SUBSTANTIAL CONFORMANCE WITH THE PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS LICENSED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION. I HEREBY AFFIX MY SEAL THIS DAY OF \_\_\_\_\_ 2006.

- 3) The renewal fee of [REDACTED] (Please make checks payable to Broward County Board of County Commissioners).

Upon submittal of the above items, a verification inspection will be conducted as soon as possible. It is expected that:

- all storm drains are clear from debris (trash, sediments, etc.) which would hinder the system's performance or degrade water quality,
- all lake & canal banks (where applicable) are well sodded & nurtured for protection from erosion, and
- all major drainage structures or outfall structures (where applicable) are free from obstructions and have not been altered without the approval of Broward County and any other government agency (city/state/federal). A major drainage structure is a structure that was designed to direct stormwater from your development or property into a city, county, or state canal or storm sewer system (i.e., away from your development).
